Using Pictorial Narratives to Help Clients Get Unstuck

Pictorial Narratives represent a narrative-informed counseling intervention by which counselors of all theoretical orientations can gain an enhanced understanding of their clients' problems and goals, as well as a means to help them achieve their goals. The intervention uses client-produced, client-interpreted drawings of their problem, their preferred outcome, and one small step that they would be willing to take to "move" from the problem to the preferred outcome. As the client interprets the meanings ascribed to the drawings in the presence of an empathically attuned counselor, a rich, descriptive therapeutic conversation ensues in which the

client experiences the sense of being heard, listened to, and validated. It is within this dialogue that therapeutic change can occur. Participants will be trained to implement this user-friendly intervention by engaging in it experientially.

Goals & Objectives: Participants will (1) understand the theoretical foundation upon which the Pictorial Narrative intervention is based; (2) become familiar with findings from research on the Pictorial Narrative intervention; (3) learn to implement the intervention by engaging in it experientially, and (4) learn how the intervention can be applied in various counseling contexts.
